Minutes of the Meeting of Project Appraisal Committee (PAC) held on 07.10.2021

The third meeting of the Project Appraisal Committee (PAC) set up under the Scheme of Special Central Assistance to Scheduled Castes Sub Plan (SCA to SCSP) for the year 2021-22 was held through online mode on 07-10-2021 at 03:00 PM. During the meeting, the Annual Action Plans (AAPs) of the State Government(s)/Union Territory Administration(s) of Andhra Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir, Chhattisgarh, Tamil Nadu (Revised AAP), Uttarakhand (Revised AAP) and Chandigarh were discussed.

- 2. During the meeting, the AAP submitted by the State Government(s)/Union Territory Administration(s) were discussed in detail. The Secretary, Department of Social Justice and Empowerment, reiterated the significance of project-based approach and outlined the three (03) fundamental principles which are required to be followed by the State Government(s)/Union Territory Administration(s) while preparing their projects, finalizing the AAP and implementing the Scheme:
 - I. **Decentralization in Project Planning** Project planning should have the *bottom-up approach* and project preparation should initiate at Village/Block/District level in consultation with the stakeholders and after assessment of the local needs. Projects thus formulated, shall be appraised by the district authorities. All such projects, which are approved by the district level authorities shall further be assessed and collated by the State authorities on merit basis before finalizing the action plan.
 - II. Outcome Oriented Projects The goal of the projects shall be the *outcome* in terms of number of target vulnerable families that can be brought out of dire poverty in a sustainable manner rather than the mere *output* in terms of amount of subsidy disbursed, number of beneficiaries trained, etc. These (disbursal of subsidy or, skill training of the target population) may be the part of the larger project and shall not be the stand-alone project. The idea is that the effect of the project should be long lasting and not ephemeral. Therefore, the State Government(s)/Union Territory Administration(s) should formulate the projects in a manner that could bring sustainable livelihood to the target population and, thereafter, positive outcomes in the Society. An example of milk-route project was enunciated in this regards, wherein many small projects such as farming of cattle feeds, rearing of milch animals, storage and transportation of dairy product, opening up of dairy booth, etc. are interlinked to create an ecosystem of projects that brings sustainable livelihood to the dairy farmers and other persons involved in different activities.
 - III. Fund Flow Mechanism State Government(s)/Union Territory Administration(s) has to adopt the new method of release of funds under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme(CSS) as per the guidelines stipulated by the Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance. The crux of the guidelines is as follows:
 - a. Creation of Single Nodal Agency(SNA) and Single Nodal Account in scheduled commercial bank by the State Government(s)/Union Territory Administration(s) for each scheme
 - b. Mapping of Single Nodal account details in PFMS

 The new fund flow mechanism must be adhered to and the above details must be communicated to this Ministry expeditiously. The necessary provisions for sending funds directly to the Implementing Agencies is also being incorporated and, wherever SNA details are not received from the State Government(s)/Union Territory Administration(s), funds would be directly transferred to the Bank Accounts of Implementing Agencies. It was further reiterated that the Single Nodal Account and account of Implementing Agencies (IAs) should ideally be in the same bank for seamless transactions.

3. A detailed discussion of the projects submitted by the State Government(s)/Union Territory Administration(s) under their Annual Action Plans for the year 2021-22 was held. The observations and decision taken by the committee on the State/UT-wise AAPs are as under:

A. ANDHRA PRADESH:

The Annual Action Plan (AAP) submitted by the State Government has been approved by the committee. Funds will be released subject to the condition that: -

- i. Single Nodal Agency is created and mapped with PFMS and the same is communicated to this Ministry;
- ii. Utilization Certificates (UCs) for the year 2020-21 is submitted.

B. JAMMU AND KASHMIR

The committee observed that the action plan only contains the distribution of funds among different districts and domains and does not specify the projects in details. However, the committee accorded in-principal approval to the Annual Action Plan for the year 2021-22 subject to the condition that: -

- i. Proper Projects are prepared and submitted/uploaded on the website and submission of project-wise revised AAP;
- ii. Utilization of the unspent balance;
- iii. Pending Utilization Certificates (UCs) are submitted.

C. CHHATTISGARH

The Annual Action Plan (AAP) has been approved by the committee. Funds will be released subject to the condition that: -

- i. Single Nodal Agency is created and mapped with PFMS and the same is communicated to this Ministry.
- ii. Pending Utilization Certificates (UCs) are reconciled and submitted to the Ministry

D. TAMIL NADU (REVISED AAP)

It is observed by the committee that there is an exemplary improvement in the action plan and the action plan, to the extent of notional allocation for the State Government, has been approved by the committee and it has been assured that, if budget permits, the notional allocation may be revised in due course of time. Funds will be released subject to the condition that the pending Utilization Certificates(UCs) are submitted.

E. UTTARAKHAND (REVISED AAP)

The committee recommended that the projects need to be reformulated as per the broad guidelines mentioned in para 2 above and advised them to go through the projects and action plan of some of the States such as Tripura, Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh for better project formulation. It was also advised that they can physically visit some of the projects of Uttar Pradesh or Andhra Pradesh to get some good idea of the project.

F. CHANDIGARH

The committee observed that the action plan submitted by the Union Territory of Chandigarh was very raw and sketchy and, therefore, their AAP was not approved. The Committee directed them to reformulate the plan in project-based manner and as per the broad guidelines mentioned in para 2 above.

The meeting concluded with vote of thanks to the chair.

Objective:

Agricultural programme plays a vital role in agriculture to take up various farming operations in time, to reduce the cost of cultivation, to increase the farm power availability, to mitigate the labour shortage, to attract the youth in Agriculture and to introduce for the development of 156 Agriculture new technologies. <u>Outcome</u>: This project aims at providing benefits to the total of 34179 SC beneficiaries by providing financial assistance of Rs..6303.78 Lakhs which creates a sustainable ecosystem that could bring out the large number of vulnerable families of the target from the vicious circle of poverty.
