## Minutes of the 4<sup>th</sup> Meeting of Project Appraisal Committee (PAC) held on 17.11.2021

The fourth meeting of the Project Appraisal Committee (PAC) set up under the Scheme of Special Central Assistance to Scheduled Castes Sub Plan (SCA to SCSP) for the year 2021-22 was held through offline mode on 17.11.2021 at 12.00 PM. During the meeting, the Annual Action Plans(AAPs) of the State Government(s)/Union Territory Administration(s) of **Rajasthan (Re-revised)**, **Karnataka**, **Manipur**, **Telangana and Jharkhand** were discussed.

- 2. During the meeting, the AAP submitted by the State Government(s)/Union Territory Administration(s) were discussed in detail. The Secretary, Department of Social Justice and Empowerment, reiterated the significance of project-based approach and outlined the three (o3) fundamental principles which are required to be followed by the State Government(s)/Union Territory Administration(s) while preparing their projects, finalizing the AAP and implementing the Scheme as under:
  - 1. **Decentralization in Project Planning** Project planning should have the *bottom-up approach* and project preparation should initiate at Village/Block/District level in consultation with the stakeholders and after assessment of the local needs. Projects thus formulated, shall be appraised by the district authorities. All such projects, which are approved by the district level authorities shall further be assessed and collated by the State authorities on merit basis before finalizing the action plan.
  - **Outcome Oriented Projects** The goal of the projects shall be the *outcome* in terms II. of number of target vulnerable families that can be brought out of dire poverty in a sustainable manner rather than the mere output in terms of amount of subsidy disbursed, number of beneficiaries trained, etc. These (disbursal of subsidy or skill training of the target population) may be the part of the larger project and shall not be the stand-alone project. The idea is that the effect of the project should be long lasting Therefore, the Government(s)/Union ephemeral. State Administration(s) should formulate the projects in a manner that could bring sustainable livelihood to the target population and, thereafter, positive outcomes in the Society. An example of milk-route project was enunciated in this regards, wherein many small projects such as farming of cattle feeds, rearing of milch animals, storage and transportation of dairy product, opening up of dairy booth, etc. are interlinked to create an ecosystem that brings sustainable livelihood to the dairy farmers and other persons involved in different activities.
- III. NSFDC was directed to build a team of 10-12 persons to assist the States in livelihood planning through cluster development, SHG formation etc. Exposure visits will also be organised for State officials to study the successful projects in other States.
- IV. **Fund Flow Mechanism** State Government(s)/Union Territory Administration(s) has to adopt the new method of release of funds under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme(CSS) as per the guidelines stipulated by the Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance. The crux of the guidelines is as follows:
  - a. Creation of Single Nodal Agency(SNA) and opening of Single Nodal Account in scheduled commercial bank by the State Government(s)/Union Territory Administration(s) for each scheme
  - b. Mapping of Single Nodal Account details in the Public Finance Management System(PFMS) and also mapping of the Single Nodal Account with the accounts of the authorities in the scheme hierarchy.

The new fund flow mechanism must be adhered to and the above details must be communicated to this Department expeditiously. The necessary provisions for sending funds directly to the Implementing Agencies is also being incorporated and, wherever SNA details are not received from the State Government(s)/Union Territory Administration(s), funds would be directly transferred to the Bank Accounts of Implementing Agencies. It was further reiterated that the Single Nodal Account and account of Implementing Agencies (IAs) should ideally be in the same bank for seamless transactions.

3. A detailed discussion of the projects submitted by the State Government(s)/Union Territory Administration(s) under their Annual Action Plans for the year 2021-22 was held. The observations and decision taken by the committee on the State/UT-wise AAPs are as under:

#### A. Rajasthan:

The State informed that the projects have been designed with involvement of the District Collectors. The Annual Action Plan (AAP) submitted by the State Government was approved by the Committee. Funds will be released subject to the condition that: -

- i. Single Nodal Agency is created and mapped with PFMS and the same is communicated to this Department along with the requisite undertaking;
- ii. Pending Utilization Certificates (UCs) are submitted;
- iii. Skill Development components may be implemented with the help of Training Programmes being run by the Central Government.
- iv. In case of Income Generation projects, the system in the State should be developed while implementing the Scheme which is sustainable for a long period. For this cluster based or SHG approach should be used, backward and forward linkages may be ensured;
- v. The State Should bring more clarity in their proposed Income Generation Scheme in the domain of Minor Irrigation which should also be linked to cultivation projects;
- vi. State should maintain the data base of the beneficiaries under the activities proposed in the AAP submitted by the State;
- vii. Sh. M. Raju, Dy. Director from NITI Aayog suggested that the State to see the model of proposals made by the State Government of Karnataka.

#### **B.** Karnataka:

State officials informed that the AAP has been prepared in consultation with NRLM and NULM. It has been ensured that the individual beneficiaries are a part of an established SHG. The Annual Action Plan (AAP) submitted by the State Government has been approved by the Committee. Funds will be released subject to the condition that: -

- i. Single Nodal Agency is created and mapped with PFMS and the same is communicated to this Department along with the requisite undertaking;
- ii. Income Generation and Skill Development components will be implemented with the help of Self Help Groups (SHGs) and may be implemented with proper training.

- iii. Under the Infrastructure Development components, the State will develop the roads proposed in the in the SC majority villages should have proper drainage.
- iv. The additional infrastructure proposed in the hostels should include digital libraries as well.
- v. Market linkages should be ensured for artisans covered under skill development.

#### C. Manipur:

The Income General and Skill Development activities proposed in the Annual Action Plan (AAP) submitted by the State Government have not been approved by the committee. It was observed that the details submitted have not be well drafted and it needs to be drafted as per Guidelines based on the activities linked with training and having a complete life cycle, building an ecosystem for the beneficiaries.

Sh. Rajnish Kumar Jenav, CMD from NSFDC suggested the State to organize Training Programmes addressing life cycle and ecosystem in the state for activities under Income Generation and Skill Development.

The Committee approved the Infrastructure Developments projects and funds will be released subject to the following conditions:

i.

- i. Single Nodal Agency is created and mapped with PFMS and the same is communicated to this Department along with the requisite undertaking;
- ii. Pending Utilization Certificates (UCs) are submitted;
- iii. Beneficiary details for the year 2019-20 are submitted;
- iv. Pending Periodic Progress Reports are submitted.

#### D. Telangana

It was informed by the State officials that likely beneficiaries have already been identified for the income generating schemes. Under the Economic support schemes, 39 schemes have also been already identified.

It was advised that the borewell scheme should be linked with drip irrigation, so as to make optimal use of available water.

The Annual Action Plan (AAP) has been approved by the Committee. Funds will be released subject to the condition that: -

- i. Single Nodal Agency is created and mapped with PFMS and the same is communicated to this Department along with the requisite undertaking;
- ii. Pending Utilization Certificates (UCs) are reconciled and submitted to the Ministry.

#### E. Jharkhand

It was informed by the State Government that the State is using the cluster approach in the implementation of the Animal Husbandry component. Under the Unnat Gram Yopjana SC majority villages will be covered. Separate projects have been identified for each village depending on the needs identified. Coaching has been

proposed in the coaching institute which is being run by the Government itself. The renovation has been proposed in 3 Govt.Aided SC residential scholls.

The Annual Action Plan (AAP) has been approved by the Committee. Funds will be released subject to the condition that: -

- i. Single Nodal Agency is created and mapped with PFMS and the same is communicated to this Department along with the requisite undertaking;
- ii. Pending Utilization Certificates (UCs) are reconciled and submitted to the Ministry.
- iii. The renovation of hostels should be proposed under BJRCY separately.

The meeting concluded with vote of thanks to the chair.
